#### What's going on in Unity Park?

Community Housing Network has secured two tax credit reservations in the past year totaling \$6.4 million and will construct an additional 24 –lease-to-purchase homes in the Unity Park neighborhood. Construction of the first 32 homes were completed in early 2015.

"With the new construction, we will have built 56 long-term, lease-to-purchase homes in the Unity Park neighborhood in the past three years," said Community Housing Network's vice president of Development Kirsten Elliott.

The Unity Park Rentals Phase III development broke ground this winter and, Phase II construction is expected to begin this summer. Occupancy is expected by the end of the year. For both developments, homes will be built on properties that were once vacant, blighted or foreclosed.

"We are honored that we are able to continue to bring investment into the city of Pontiac," Elliott said.

"There are a lot of great activities happening in the neighborhood and in Pontiac, such as the community garden coalition, Little Libraries and the M-1 Concourse going in just down the street on Woodward."
